# Iranian Officials Confirm 25 Dead in Protests

The Iranian government acknowledged Sunday that 25 people had been killed during recent anti-government protests in cities throughout the country.

Judiciary spokesman Gholamhossein Mohseni Ejechi said that none of the dead were killed by security forces, as the officers were ordered not to use their weapons. A number of security officers were also among the dead, Ejechi said Sunday. He didn't provide details on how the 25 people were killed.

Meanwhile, a Tehran prosecutor said that over 400 people detained during demonstrations were released, according to semi-official Fars news agency.

Last week, reformist member of parliament Mahmoud Sadeghi said that about 3,700 people had been arrested during the protests. Sadeghi also reported last week that a man had committed suicide while in detention.

The protests erupted nearly three weeks ago over economic issues, but grew into widespread unrest condemning the Islamic regime as a whole, with attacks on government and police buildings.

## Iran: 55 Still Jailed in Tehran after Protests

## Iran Protester Dies in Custody, Sparking Memories of 2009 Abuse

A 22-year-old Iranian protester has died in custody, according to two Iranian lawmakers, intensifying fears of a repeat of the prisoner abuse that followed similar protests in 2009. A reformist member of parliament, Mahmoud Sadeghi, says he was told the detainee, identified as Sina Ghanbari, committed suicide.

Another lawmaker, Tayyeb Siavashi, said the detainee had been arrested in Tehran. Details of the incident were not immediately clear, but it was thought to be the...
